The Temple of the People in Halcyon Celebrates Centennial of the Blue Star Memorial Temple with an Open House Event.

Halcyon, CA— [10-10-2024]—The Temple of the People is excited to announce an open house on Sunday, November 17, 2024, from 2 PM to 4 PM, celebrating 100 years since the Blue Star Memorial Temple was constructed. The public is invited to explore the rich history and artistry within the Temple and the University Center.

Guests can tour the Temple, a beacon of community and spirituality for the past century. Attendees can also view a special collection of Hiawatha paintings by the fourth Guardian in Chief, Harold E. Forgostein, housed in the University Center. The exhibit calls attention to the 36th year anniversary of the passage of House Concurrent Resolution 331 when the 100th United States Congress officially acknowledged the contributions made by the Iroquois Confederacy (League of Six Nations) and other Indian (Indigenous People) nations to the formation and development of the United States.

Celebrating this momentous occasion, the first 100 guests will receive complimentary Temple Artisan booklets commemorating the Centennial, highlighting the Temple's heritage and its contributions to the community.
